PROFILE of the UNIVERSITY

ROLE of the POSITION

The Radiological Safety Technician (RST) provides support to the Radiological Safety Program at UNLV and satellite campuses. The primary functions of the RST are (1) to implement and maintain assigned Radiological Safety and Management Programs, (2) provide training to faculty, staff and students involved in the assigned programs and other programs as directed, (3) review assigned program documents and procedures and propose revisions on documents and procedures to keep them current with changes in federal, state and local regulations, and (4) to participate in the development of new RMS programs. The RST will be the person responsible for day to day operations of the Radiological Safety and Management Programs in absence of the Radiological Safety Officer (RSO) or his alternate, and the RSO may delegate responsibilities in the various areas of the Radiological Safety Program.

QUALIFICATIONS

Bachelor's Degree in Health Physics, Nuclear Medicine or related disciplines from an accredited college or university and five (5) years of related professional experience. Knowledge and understanding of NRC and Nevada regulations and safety issues. Familiarity with EPA and OSHA regulations. Ability to coordinate program activities, schedule time and to work independently with periodic evaluations of progress. Effective verbal and written communication skills and experience with the use of desktop software. Experience in a research educational environment is preferred.

SALARY RANGE

Salary competitive with those at similarly situated institutions. Position is contingent upon funding.
