

## CSHEMA Awards Program

CSHEMA (Campus Safety, Health & Environmental Management Association) celebrates the outstanding achievements of its members through CSHEMA's annual awards and recognition program.

The **Complete Safety Program Award** motivates members to strive for excellence in designing and implementing safety programs that incorporate novel and/or germane techniques while still meeting regulations. Honorees must meet rigorous criteria and are worthy of international recognition.

The "**Solutions That Work**" program recognizes creative problem-solving that offers solutions to difficult challenges that are unique to the campus and can be easily adapted by other institutions. Judging criteria include problem identification, implementation method, cost effectiveness, and solution relevance.

The **Newsletter Award of Excellence** recognizes on-campus and off-the-job general safety and/or laboratory safety newsletters intended for faculty, staff, students and/or a combination of these readers.

The **Perks for Peers Program** promotes interest in and encourages development of innovative programs that improve fire and life safety awareness at colleges and universities. This \$3,000 monetary award has been made possible through the generosity of Simplex/Grinnell.

### **CSHEMA SCHOLARSHIP**

One \$2,000 scholarship is offered each year to a full-time undergraduate or graduate student enrolled in a CSHEMA-member school. Entrants are required to submit an official transcript, an application form, and an essay addressing a safety, health or environmental issue relevant to their campus.

### **SPECIAL INDIVIDUAL AWARDS**

CSHEMA offers recognition in two award programs - the **Distinguished Service Award**, our highest honor, and the **Honorary Life Achievement**. These awards are presented to recipients during the Annual Conference and honor individuals who have made significant and meaningful contributions to the field of safety, health or the environment.

The **Campus Leaders Who Care Award** recognizes the outstanding involvement and support of senior administrators for their understanding of how important environmental stewardship, health and safety issues are to their institutions

**MARTY SHAUB – DISTINGUISHED SERVICE AWARD**



Marty Shaub, Director of Environmental Health and Safety at the University of Utah has been awarded the Distinguished Service Award by CSHEMA to recognize the many years of service she has provided to the health and safety field throughout the country. The Distinguished Service Award is the highest award given to individuals by the international organization in recognition of outstanding service in the field of environmental health and Safety.

Not only has Marty Shaub been a leader in her own institution in developing and leading environmental health and safety programs for the past 20 years, but she has served the CSHEMA membership as Chair of the Publications Committee, as Newsletter Editor, Member and Chair of the Strategic Planning Committee, a member of the Executive

Committee, Secretary, Vice-Chair and Chair of the organization. Marty and her staff also hosted the annual CSHEMA conference in 1996 at the University of Utah.

Marty has also been a member, and currently the President-Elect of the Utah Emergency Management Association. Marty presented a seminar to the Inaugural Emergency Management Planning Conference for Utah; was an evaluator on a Pandemic Planning Exercise for the Utah Department of Health in 2007, and assumed many other positions of leadership with the U. S. Office of Compliance, the Rocky Mountain Center for Occupational and Environmental Health and Safety, and many other State and local Advisory Boards. Marty Shaub epitomizes the meaning of a dedicated professional and is very worthy of being the first recipient of the DSA award for the new CSHEMA as she, as much as any single individual, has helped create the initiative to move CSHEMA to the new beginnings as an independent organization.

**CHUCK HART – HONORARY LIFE ACHIEVEMENT AWARD**



Charles (Chuck) Hart, former Director of Environmental Health & Safety at Ohio University in Athens, OH has been awarded the Honorary Life Achievement Award by CSHEMA. This award is granted to individuals who have made significant and meaningful contributions to safety, health or the environment as a member of CSHEMA. The level of service that is recognized represents long term and substantial contributions to the organization.

“Chuck” retired from Ohio University in January 2007, where he served in the Environmental Health and Safety Office as an industrial hygienist, chemical hygiene officer, biosafety officer and the Director over a period of 24 years. Chuck previously

worked in public health as a County Health Commissioner, County Director of Environmental Health, State Health Dept. Epidemiologist, and County Environmental Sanitarian. Chuck has spent countless hours over the past 20 years volunteering his services to CSHEMA. Among his many accomplishments were his tenure as a member of the Executive Committee, as well as chair of several different committees.

Chuck is currently completing a PhD in Biological Sciences at Ohio University, specializing in environmental health and spatial analysis. He is a board certified industrial hygienist, board certified safety professional, state and nationally registered sanitarian, and a registered biosafety professional. Chuck has previously won the National Environmental Health Association/National Science Foundation Sabbatical Exchange Award to the UK. Currently, Chuck is an adjunct faculty member of environmental and occupational health and safety in the School of Health Sciences at Ohio University and president of WorkSafe, Ltd., a consulting company specializing in management consulting and training in environmental and occupational health & safety for research, educational, and institutional organizations.
